

WHAT TO DO IF MY MOVIE IS LARGER THAN 2GB?

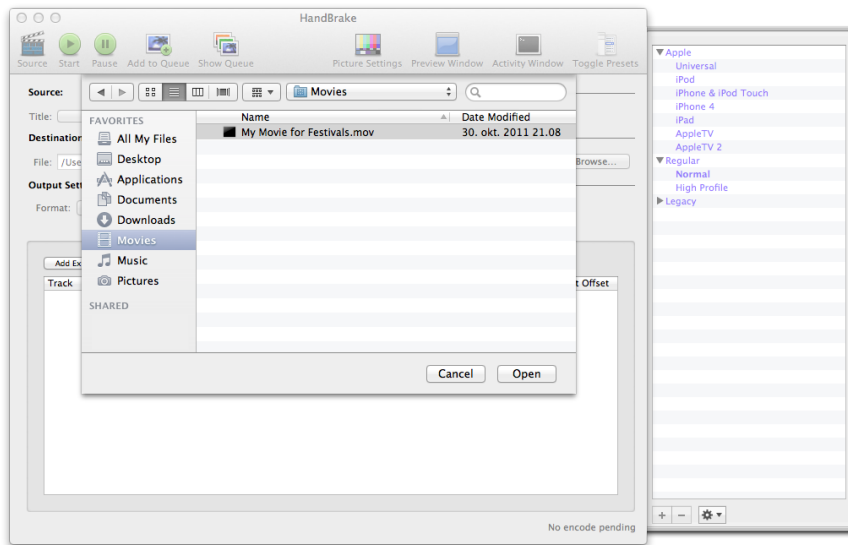
For the festival's first stage of screening and selecting movies, we only need a smaller copy of your work. If the movie is selected we'll need a digital copy of the film in the best quality available for cinema screening.

If your file is larger than 2GB you'll need to encode a smaller version. The easiest solution is to use the free application "Handbrake" to do this.

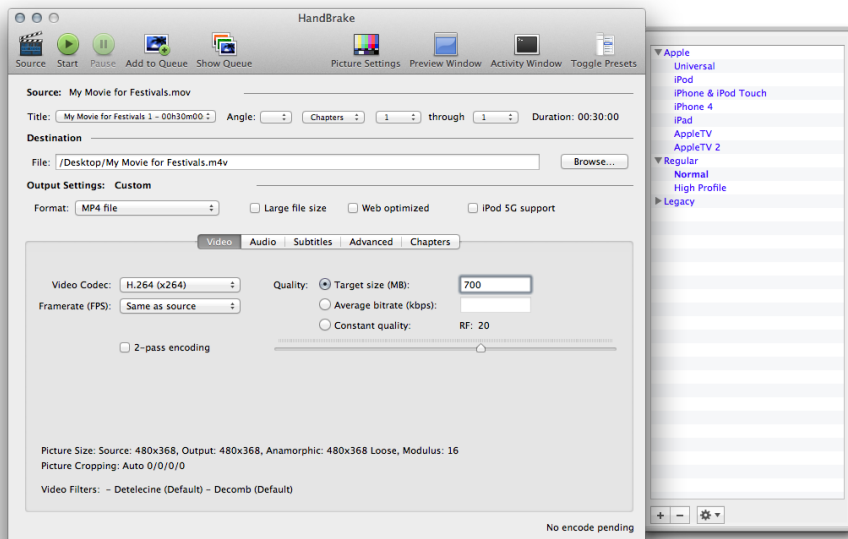
1. Download Handbrake at <http://handbrake.fr/downloads.php> - It's FREE and available for Windows, Mac OS X and Linux. Install and open the application.

The screenshots below are from the Mac OS X version. Versions may vary, but the process is identically.

2. Open your file...



3. Select your settings (or use Handbrake's default). Make sure the target size of the file you're encoding is less than 2GB (2000 MB). Press start and wait.



4. Once you have a smaller preview version of your film you'll be able to upload to the festival. Reducing your file size will also make uploads faster if you're on a slow internet connection.
